

Foundation Track

TRF + Global Grants. Kathleen Davis, Tressa Kentner

This training will provide an overview of how to leverage club dollars with matching global grants when doing a service project. Attendees will learn the steps to create global grants and the application process. A total of two members must attend Global and/or Distrct Grant training in order for the club to qualify for matching grants. Tressa Kenter, Chair of International Service Committee, will share tips on securing partners for grants. There will be a session during the break for you to share your service project and look for other clubs with which to partner.

TRF + District Grants. Cathy Burnell, Annette Grimm

This workshop will provide an overview of the integral role of The Rotary Foundation and how your funds are leveraged to provide a multiplier effect when applying for a district grant to support local club service projects. A total of two members must attend Global and/or Distrct Grant training in order for the club to qualify for matching grants.Note: this training is different than the global grant training. There will be a session during the break for you to share your service project and look for other clubs with which to partner.

Club Operations Track

Club Communication Tools. Kay Cook, District DACdb Trainer & Support

This hands-on workshop offers learning primarily in how to administer and leverage Rotary's DacDb as a communication and club administration tool, and the importance of using it for record keeping and tie-in to Rotary International. The session will also review some third-party tools that can be used for club marketing and communications. This workshop requires you to bring a laptop or tablet computer.

Club Treasurer & Secretary Roles. Facilitator to be determined

The club treasurer and club secretary roles are important in terms of required record keeping and reporting for club documents and finances. Both roles include managing legal and financial risk for the club. This combined session covering both roles, will focus on the key elements and best practices, as well as Rotary International and District requirements.

Assistant Governor Role. Rachele Bouchand, District Governor-Elect

This workshop will outline the roles, responsibilities and expectations of assistant governors who represent the District Governor. This session will provide AG's with opportunities to build strong and cohesive connections with and between clubs within our District 5030.
