
A District 5030 Leadership Program

A six-week hybrid program that includes networking, **five** virtual classes and a mentor pairing





Trainings draw upon proven leadership concepts focused on serving others and growing executive skills applicable to business or profession and Rotary

District 5030 was the first to adapt and launch this program and include a mentor match

- Increase the stickiness of new members
- Content is immediately applicable to the workplace
- Rotary principles are paired with leadership best practices
