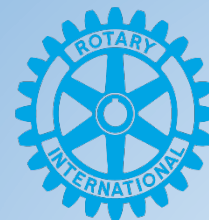

WHAT IS RYLA?

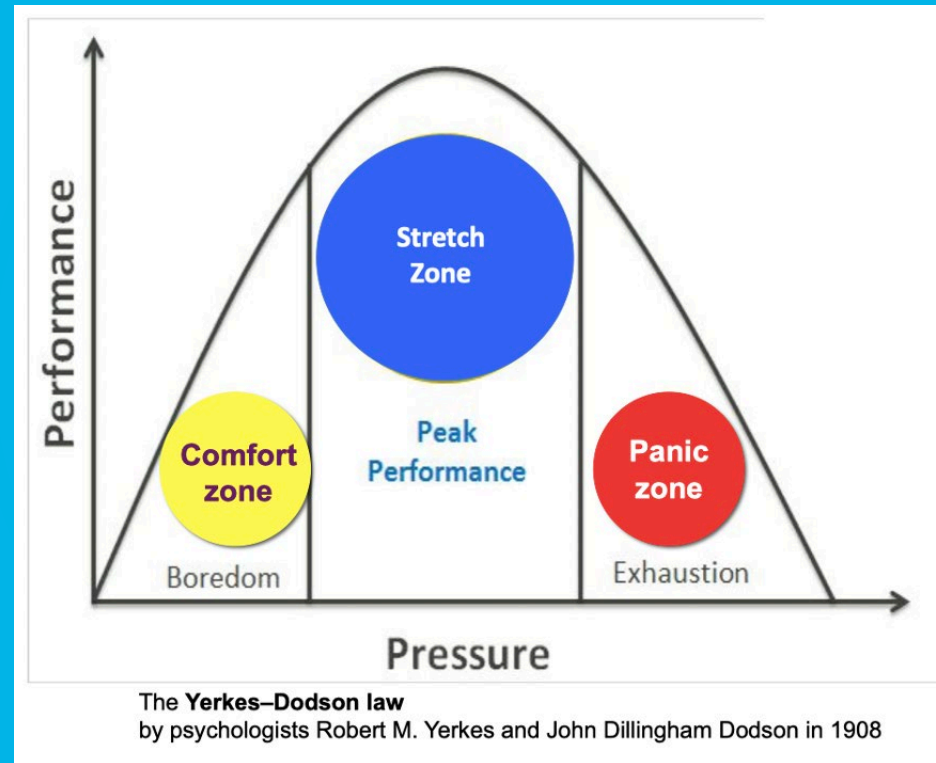


an intensive leadership experience

Students organized into small groups (10-12 students) for individual and team challenges.



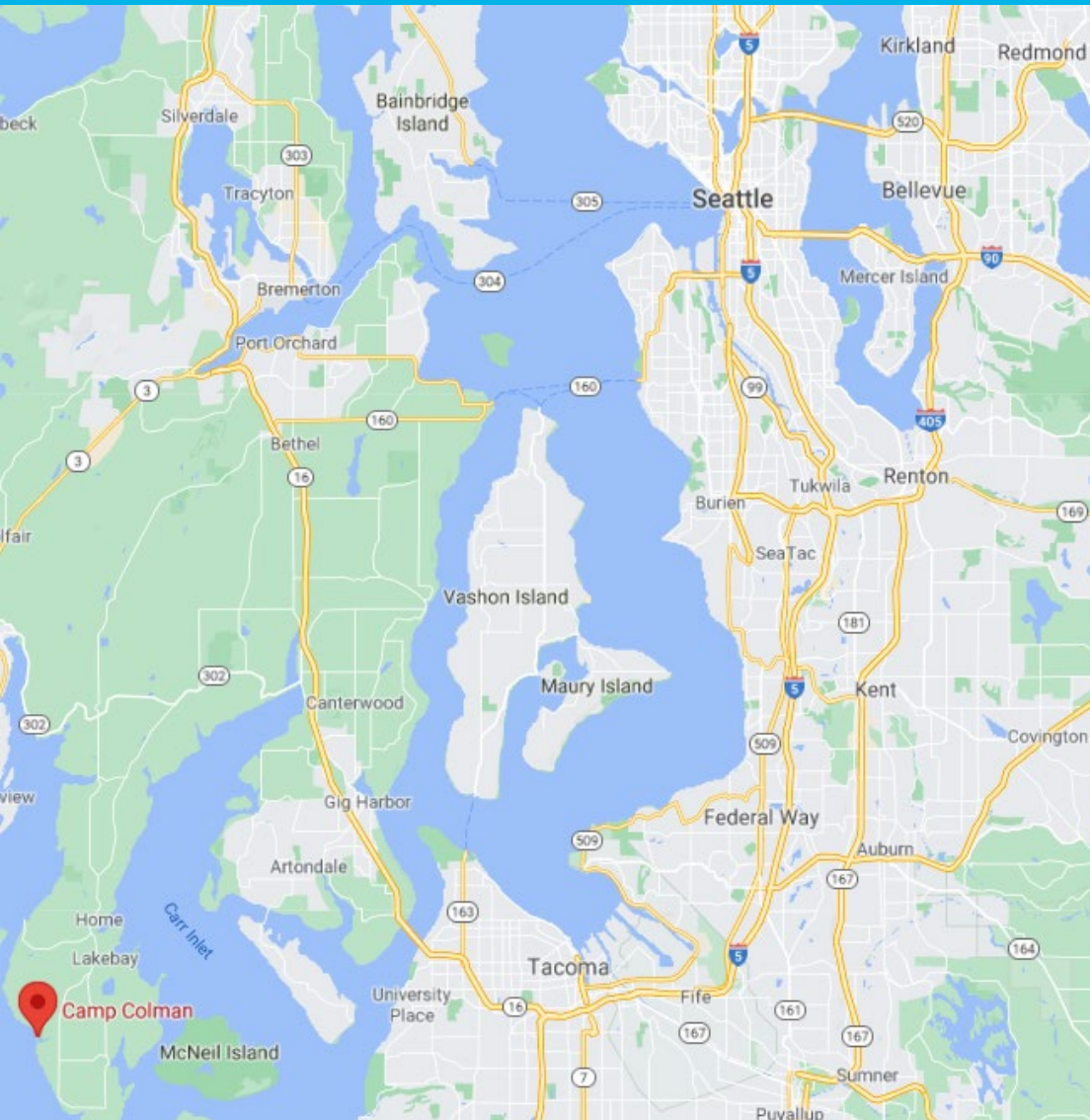
STAFFING

YOUR TO DO LIST: HOW TO SPONSOR A STUDENT

4. Get familiar with the RYLA Application on DACdb
5. Determine your selection process & get students registered.
6. Communicate with your selected student and their family. Make sure your student:
 1. plans to attend, and
 2. has a way to get to the conference.
